TRAVEL INFORMATION

Options for travelling from Helsinki Airport to Helsinki Central Railway Station are as follows:

- By train: Helsinki Airport's train station is located under the terminal. Local I and P trains operate to and from Helsinki Airport. A train ride to Helsinki City Centre takes about 30 minutes. Local train tickets can be purchased from HSL's mobile app, or from the ticket machine at the train platform. Timetables, tickets and fares for local trains can be found on the [HSL website](https://www.hsl.fi/en).
- By bus: Bus route 600 operates between Helsinki Airport and Helsinki City Centre. The travel time is about 40 minutes. Tickets can be purchased online on HSL's mobile app, or at the bus station's ticket machine.
- If necessary, you can also take a taxi. We recommend using Taxi Helsinki or Lähitaxi. It costs approximately 60–70 euros.

ACCOMMODATION

There is no block reservation for the meeting participants. There are numerous hotels within walking distance from the meeting venue and the Helsinki Central Station. You can find Helsinki hotel accommodations from different service providers like Booking.com, Hotels.com or Trivago.
